## Re: Say no to abuse

The Judiciary Police arrested a man recently for stalking and secretly taking pictures of students during busy hours, after receiving tip-offs via the Safe School Network. The offender has been transferred to the Public Prosecutions Office for further enquiry.

Similar cases happened sporadically in Macao and the Judiciary Police urge students to be on their guard at all times. Tell the person firmly who tries to follow, tape or brush up against you to stay away, and report the incident to the police at once. If you feel you have been violated in any way, please remember, it is not your fault!

The Judiciary Police continues to working closely with local schools and conducting anticrime talks on sexual offence to reinforce students' awareness against sexual offences and on protecting themselves from being victimized.
